"Taxation with representation: The political economy of foreigners' voting rights" (Job market paper). This paper develops a model to examine the effect of immigrants' political rights on the size and composition of public spending when preferences for redistribution depend on individuals' skill level and cultural beliefs. I test empirically the implications of the model using an original dataset that combines municipality-level data on Swiss referenda about non-citizen voting rights and immigrants' relative economic position and cultural preferences for redistribution.
